Mission Myanmar Judah and Khaw Tangshing



God is working in Myanmar for the advancement of the gospel! An estimated 61 million people live in Myanmar, and many have not yet heard the gospel. 92% of the population is Buddhist. After decades of being a closed country, Myanmar's government is changing, and improved foreign relations has led to more opportunities for evangelism. It is an exciting time for this ministry, and we are all eager and honored to be a part of what God is doing.

This year, in addition to the orphanages in Wireless and Putao, new orphanages have been established in Jung Byaw and Bagu villages! Judah's ministry also continues to support Bible college students and native missionaries to unreached areas. 2015 promises to be an exciting year with potential growth... ...more on page 2

Priority Haiti Medsh De Morisseau



This year, Priority One began supporting a Christian school in a small Haitian village called Morrisseau. The church there founded a school for children who would otherwise not attend school, since many families cannot afford to pay for private school and the public school is overcrowded.

Currently, the school we support has 80 students in grades 1-5, four teachers, and a principal. The school has used donor support to pay teachers and equip them with necessary supplies, and also to provide students daily lunch, allowing them to complete a full school day rather than a half day. The students have an opportunity to learn about Jesus daily in Bible class, which is included in the school curriculum. In August 2013, God opened the door for Ben and Jaimie Homan to move to Nagpur, India, to help establish an orphanage. While the original plans for an orphanage did not come to fruition. Ben and Jaimie lived in Nagpur, encouraged the believers at New Bidipeth Christian Church, and also shared the gospel with their Hindu friends. They returned to the United States in late March 2014 after much prayer and waiting for God's direction. ...opportunities in Bagu, Yangon, and the remote region of Bamauk. Here is a recap of how God has worked through Judah's ministry last year:

- 2 new orphanages, Jung Byaw and Bagu, were established, and now we have a total of 86 children. Last year we had 2 orphanages, Yangon and Putao, and a total of 50 children.
- A new multi-purpose building (used for church meetings and an orphanage dining hall) was constructed in Jung Byaw, along with a sleeping dorm for the new orphanage.
- 17 new believers were baptized.
- 24 evangelists were supported.
- 2 Bible colleges were supported.
- 2 homes for church members in need were constructed.
- Many seminars and community outreach events were held at all of our locations. Mission teams and traveling
 evangelists visited and participated.

Two POW board members were able to visit Judah and his church in January 2014. We traveled to the new church and orphanage in Jung Byaw, visited church members in Wireless, and attended a seminar where we shared scripture teaching and encouragement with the believers. The time we spent with these brothers and sisters was a life-changing and encouraging blessing for us! In case you missed it, you can read our prayer report from this trip on our blog.

Also, as many of you know, we have been in prayer concerning the church and orphanage in Jung Byaw and the opposition from local authorities. No resolution has been reached yet. No formal meeting with higher level authorities has taken place yet, only threats and confrontations from the local Buddhist monk and local authorities. These village leaders tried to stop the Christmas celebration at the church in Jung Byaw, but were unsuccessful. Please pray for wisdom, peace, and bold faith for the Jung Byaw children, church, and leaders. Until this tension is resolved, no further building will take place on this property. Once it is resolved, another children's dorm will be built.
